

8G DRESS CODE BASICS

1. Clothing should be modest and clean without wrinkles, tears, stains or fraying.
2. Clothing should be uniform style, not too tight or too loose.
3. Clothing should not have any logo (even ANC) other than BACS.
4. Pants/shorts must be navy or khaki.
5. Skirts must be navy, khaki or BACS plaid.
6. Skirts/shorts must be no shorter than 4" off the floor when kneeling (approximately 1" above the knee cap when standing).
7. Plain colored dark spandex (not hot pink multi-colored) must be worn underneath uniform skirts.
8. Plaid may only be worn with red, white, navy, or light uniform blue.
9. All colors of polo shirts and button-up shirts are acceptable (except with plaid).
10. Undershirts, if worn, should be white and tucked in.
11. Shirts with tails must be tucked in.
12. Sweaters and fleeces are limited to the following colors: red, white (not cream), or navy (not blue).
13. No coats or sweatshirt material may be worn during school hours.
14. Shoes and sandals are limited to the following colors: black, brown, tan, gray or navy (plus white for sandals).
15. Socks or tights must be worn with closed shoes. Colors include: black, brown, tan, red, white, or navy.
16. Leggings or footless tights must be long enough to meet socks of the same color.
17. Casual event wear (for field trips) includes: uniform bottom, red polo, uniform socks/shoes, and if needed, a uniform sweater or fleece.

18. Formal event wear (for the Christmas program) includes: white button-up shirt, uniform bottom, uniform socks/shoes, and if needed, a red or navy sweater.
19. Hair should be its own natural color and length, and should not obscure the student's eyes.
20. Makeup should be very light so that it does not visibly stand out.
21. Jewelry should be minimal, with necklaces no longer than 24" and earrings no larger than 1.5"
22. Nail polish for both fingers and toes may be any color except black.
23. Any clothing or accessory items not listed in the official dress code (such as scarves or leg warmers) are not to be worn during classes.

In 8th grade, the dress code is enforced diligently and as consistently as possible with the intention of maintaining both modesty and fairness. Students are tested on the guidelines above by the end of week one, and are held accountable for them. Dress code infractions will result in detentions. A student with frequent dress code infractions will be referred to the director for further disciplinary action.
